

Title: Podcast with Restored 2 More (Clinton & Charity Muñoz)

Greetings all,

Just a quick note to let you know that I recently recorded a podcast with Clinton & Charity Muñoz, a couple who have a ministry that especially offers resources for other couples who have experienced the trauma of betrayal.

The podcast includes a short summary of my journey to the Immanuel approach, and then addresses the following questions from Clinton and Charity:

1. I've seen God heal others, and sometimes miraculously. I could not understand why God would not free me from my struggles regarding sexuality. I developed a bitterness toward God for not healing me, and this caused an increasing chasm between the Lord and I. Can you help us understand how/why this happens, and share thoughts about how to address this problem?
2. What about people who feel that doing this kind of healing work would be overwhelming? Who are afraid that it would be too painful? What about people who feel like they don't have the capacity to do this kind of healing work?
3. What recommendations would you offer to a person who has just learned that their partner has been unfaithful?

Also, on some devices the nuggets at the bottom will be out of view when the first screen opens – you have to scroll "below the fold" – that is, beneath the content initially visible.)
