I have been getting a lot of e-mails asking when we will be doing our next Immanuel Approach training seminars. The bad news is that we will not be doing any Immanuel Approach training seminars in 2021.

The good news is that I have been working on a series of Immanuel Approach training videos for the past 16 months. (Most of you have already seen pieces of this project.) Hopefully, I will finish this project in the next few months, and then it will be available as a training package. In addition to the draft-version segments that many of you have already seen, the final training package will include a 20 minute introduction to the Immanuel Approach, segments on each of the two variations of the full Immanuel Approach healing process that we present in our Basic Training seminars, and a segment on intimacy with Jesus. The full video training package will essentially be a condensed version of our Basic Training seminar.

And more good news is that a number of others are also providing training regarding the Immanuel Approach.
